

**Clients' Profiles Fact Sheet
 Adults Served by SSA**

Orange County has a population of 2,018,958 adults between the ages of 18 and 64*. The population increased by 1.4% from Fiscal Year (FY) 2012/13 to 2015/16, and a further increase of 1.0% is projected from FY 2015/16 to 2018/19. SSA provided one or more types of services and assistance to approximately 1 out of every 5 adult residents of the County in June 2016.
