### Bigger Than Daddy written by Harriet Ziefert; illustrated by Elliot Kreloff. Blue Apple Books, 2006.

Edward wants to be bigger than Daddy, so for one afternoon they pretend to exchange places.

#### **Bunny Cakes** written and illustrated by Rosemary Wells. Viking, 1999.

Encourages the reader to exercise by following the movements of various animals; presented in a question and answer format. **XFICP Carle**

The Gingerbread Boy eludes the hungry grasp of everyone he meets until he happens upon a fox more clever than he. **XP398.2** 

### Gunniwolf written by Wilhelmina Harper; illustrated by Barbara Upton. Dutton, 2003.

A little girl, cautioned never to go into the jungle, wanders in deeper and deeper while searching for flowers and is suddenly confronted by the Gunniwolf. **XP 398.21** 

### If You're Happy and You Know It written and illustrated by James Warhola. Orchard Books, 2007.

Jungle animals sing the verses of this popular song that encourages everyone to express their happiness through voice and movement.
