<u>Butterfly, Butterfly</u> by Petr Horáček (2007). Lucy's garden is full of colorful creatures that wriggle and spin, scurry and slither. XFICP HORACEK P

<u>Colors</u> by Shelley Rotner (2019). A red fire truck, orange pumpkins, and more in vivid pictures of familiar things that inspire children to look more carefully. XFICP ROTNER S

<u>Deep in the Ocean</u> by Lucy Brunellière (2019). Explore the ocean in this beautifully illustrated, oversized book. XFICP BRUNELLIERE L

<u>Fall Is Not Easy</u> by Marty Kelley (1998). A tree tells why, out of all four seasons, autumn is the hardest. XFICP KELLEY M

*First the Egg* by Laura Vaccaro Seeger (2007). Which came first? The chicken or the egg? This is a book about transformations - from egg to chicken, seed to flower and caterpillar to butterfly. XP 571.8 SEEGER L

<u>If You Plant a Seed</u> by Kadir Nelson (2015). A lovely story about growing vegetables and kindness. XFICP NELSON K

In the Tall Tall Grass by Denise Fleming (1991). Rhymed text presents a toddler's view of creatures found in the grass from lunchtime till nightfall. XFICP FLEMING D

<u>Mama Built a Little Nest</u> by Jennifer Ward (2004). Investigates a wide variety of birds and their nests. XP 598.1564 WAR

<u>Mister Seahorse</u> by Eric Carle (2004). Follow Mister Seahorse as he meets other ocean fathers while caring for his eggs. XFICP CARLE E

<u>My Friend Earth</u> by Patricia MacLachlan and Francesca Sanna (2020). Investigate the seasons and learn how the Earth is a friend to all. XFICP MACLACHLAN P

<u>Over and Under the Pond</u> by Kate Messner (2017). Discover the plants and animals living in a mountain pond. XP 577.636 MES <u>Round</u> by Jennifer Ward and Lisa Congdon (2020). A rhyming story about all of the round things you can find in nature. XFICP WARD J

<u>A Stone Sat Still</u> by Brendan Wenzel (2019). A rhyming story focusing on a stone experiencing the changing natural world. XFICP WENZEL B

<u>*Tall, Tall Tree*</u> by Fredericks, Anthony D. (2017). High in a redwood tree is an unseen world of all kinds of animals. Readers will meet them through rhyming verses as they count them 1 to 10. XP 591.734 FRE

<u>Tap Tap Boom Boom</u> by Elizabeth Bluemle (2014). It's a mad dash for shelter as rain sweeps into an urban neighborhood. XFICP BLUEMLE E

<u>Tap the Magic Tree</u> by Christie Matheson (2013). Invites the reader to tap, rub, touch, and wiggle illustrations to make an apple tree bloom, produce fruit, and lose its leaves. XFICP MATHESON C

<u>They All Saw a Cat</u> by Brendan Wenzel (2016). Shows the very different ways creatures see and experience the world. **XFICP WENZEL B** 

<u>A Tree Is Nice</u> by Janice May Udry (1984). Simply describes the value of a tree. XFICP UDRY J

There's a Bug on My Book by John Himmelman (2017). A fantastic interactive picture book about creatures that live in the lawn.XP 595.7 HIM

<u>Up in the Garden, Down in the Dirt</u> by Kate Messner (2015). Discover the world of life, both in the garden and under the ground. XP 635 MESS

<u>What will Grow?</u> by Jennifer Ward (2017). Seeds come in all shapes and sizes. Readers can guess what will grow when the seeds are planted. XP 575.68 WAR
