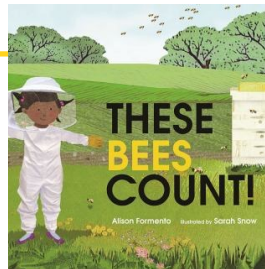
Math

Grown-up tips!

Counting songs often ask kids to count forward, which is adding, and to count backwards, which is subtracting. Even very young children will get the hang of these important early math skills when they are presented in the form of a song or fingerplay. Try using a physical object (toys, pompoms, cereal) to reinforce the idea of one-to-one correspondence mentioned in the video.
