This seasonal rhyme is fun for your child to learn and share with others. Rhymes like this one are powerful influencers in preschool development. Speech development gained from nursery rhymes has shown to significantly improve reading, spelling and other literacy skills.

In the rhyme we count to five and then we switch to ordinal numbers; first, second, third! There is also space for creativity, as each pumpkin has a personality.

Have your child act out each pumpkin's reaction in the rhyme as a way to share holiday traditions.
