
KINDERGARTEN READINESS TIPS

Talking about the weather is an easy way to introduce early science concepts to your child. Weather is something that effects your child's day and can be observed. There are clouds in the sky; will it rain? The leaves are rustling; is it windy? It's bright and sunny; do we need sunscreen? This fun rhyme gives your child the chance to mimic the sound of raindrops and to observe what happens after the rainstorm. Look for both fiction and non-fiction books about weather and climate and talk about the weather together!
