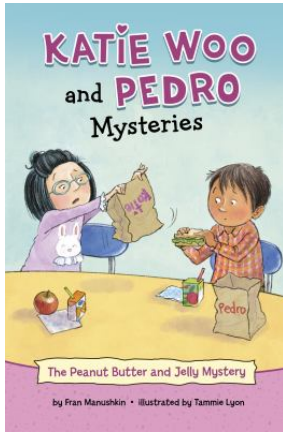


KINDERGARTEN READINESS TIPS

Grown-up Tip

Wibble Wobble – not only is it fun to say or sing, but this rhyme helps develop your child's gross and fine motor skills. Action songs benefit both these areas by incorporating movement in time with the music. As we increase the speed of the song, the speed of the motion increases. An action rhyme like Wibble Wobble can also foster self-confidence as your child learns to repeat the rhyme and the motions.
