(2012). Rhyming text divulges the many sounds heard on a farm, from a rooster's morning crow to an owl's goodnight.

Moo, Baa, La La! by Sandra Boynton (1995). Turn the pages to see what different sounds animals make.

XFICP BOYNTON S

<u>Cow Says Meow</u> by Kirst Call (2021). Perfect read aloud with silly mixed-up animal sounds.

My Very First Book of Animal Sounds by Eric Carle (2006).

Pages can be turned to match sounds with the animals that make them.

<u>Farmyard Beat</u> by Lindsey Craig (2011). The sounds of the farm animals create a lively beat that keep Farmer Sue, the chicks, sheep, and other farm animals awake.

<u>Animal Sounds</u> by Roald Dahl (2023). Learn how to make the silly sounds that animals make!

XFICP DAHL R

<u>Cock-a-Doodle Oops!</u> by Lori Degman (2014). While the rooster is gone, the pig, cow, sheep, and other farm animals attempt to rouse Farmer McPeeper with "cock-a-doodle SQUEAL," "cock-a-doodle MOO," and "cock-a-doodle BAAAA," with hilarious results.

XFICP DEGMAN L

<u>Bark, George</u> by Jules Feiffer (1999). George's mother is trying to teach him to bark like a dog, but he is making other sounds of animals even though he is a dog.

XFICP FEIFFER J

<u>All Ears, All Eyes</u> by Richard Jackson (2017). Animals hoot, chirp, whirr, and bark when darkness falls in the forest. XFICP JACKSON R

<u>Squeak!</u> **by Kvasnosky, Laura (2019).** A mouse wakes up with a squeak, and his noise sets off a chain reaction of animals waking each other up.

Moo-Moo, I Love You! by Tom Lichtenheld (2020). Udderly perfect expressions of affection to share between any cow and calf: I love you no matter your moo-d. I love giving you a big s-moo-ch.

Polar Bear, Polar Bear, What Do You Hear? by Bill Martin

(1997). Zoo animals--from polar bear to walrus--make their distinctive sounds for each other, while children imitate the sounds for the zookeeper.

<u>Animal Sounds</u> by Christopher Silas Neal (2020). This delightful board book combines animal noises to form unique, inventive sounds.

<u>Little Blue Truck</u> by Alice Schertle (2008). A small blue truck finds his way out of a jam, with a little help from his friends. **XFICP SCHERTLE A**

What This Story Needs is a Hush and a Shush by Emma

Virjan (2016). All Pig wants to do is sleep, but the farm animals are keeping her awake! Will she ever find some peace and quiet? **XFICP VIRJAN E**

<u>Pet This Book</u> by Jessica Young (2018). Illustrations and simple, rhyming text invite the reader to join in a day of pet care and hear animal sounds.

<u>Can You Whoo Too?</u> by Harriet Ziefert (2015). Why do whales sing? What does a rooster want us to know? This book is a unique combination of language arts, science, and noisy fun.
