
KINDERGARTEN READINESS TIPS




Itsy Bitsy Spider

(center hands and swipe out) Out came the sun, (raise arms above head, forming semi-circle) and dried up all the rain, (move hands down) and the itsy bitsy spider went up the spout again. (touch thumb to index finger, moving upwards)

Additional versions:

The great big hairy spider... (spoken with a deep voice, make a big circle for spider) The teeny tiny spider... (spoken with a quiet. squeaky voice, make tiny movements with fingertips)
