Whose Knees are These? by Jabari Asim (2006). Simple, playful rhyming text takes a loving look at a child's knees. XFICP ASIM J

Two Little Trains by Margaret Wise Brown (2020). Two little trains make their way West with rhyming text that offers opportunities for making fun sounds.

XFICP BROWN M

Room on the Broom by Julia Donaldson (2012). A witch finds room on her broom for all the animals that ask for a ride in this rhyming, repetitive romp.

XFICP DONALDSON J

<u>In the Small, Small Pond</u> by Denise Fleming (2013).

Illustrations and rhyming text describe the activities of animals living in and near a small pond.

XFICP FLEMING D

Where Is the Green Sheep? by Mem Fox (2004). A story about many different sheep, and one that seems to be missing.

XFICP FOX M

<u>I Can Build It!</u> by Kelly Greenawalt (2020). In rhyming text Princess Truly, super girl, uses her magic curls to build things.

XFICP GREENAWALT K

Joy by Yasmeen Ismail (2020). Rhythmic language and playful rhymes tell the adventures of a kitten and her mother.

XFICP ISMAIL Y

Squeak! Rumble! Whomp! Whomp! Whomp! by Wynton

Marsalis (2012). Takes readers on a rollicking, clanging, clapping tour through the many sounds that fill a neighborhood.

XFICP MARSALIS W

<u>Chicka Chicka Boom Boom</u> by Bill Martin Jr. (1989). An alphabet chant that relates what happens when the whole alphabet tries to climb a tree.

XFICP MARTIN B

All Are Welcome by Alexandra Penfold (2018).

Illustrations and simple, rhyming text introduce a school where diversity is celebrated.

XFICP PENFOLD A

Construction Site Mission: Demolition! by Sherri

Dusky Rinker (2020). The vehicles of the construction crew set to work demolishing an old rickety building. **XFICP RINKER S**

<u>Dr. Seuss's School Things</u> by Dr. Seuss (2020). Written in super-simple rhyme, this sweet book follows Thing One and Thing Two as they spend a typical day at school.

XFICP SEUSS DR.

<u>Hello Hello</u> **by Brendan Wenzel (2018).** In simple text a set of animals greet and interact with one another.

XFICP WENZEL B

People Don't Bite People by Lisa Wheeler (2018).

Humorous illustrations and rhyming text urge children to use their teeth for only biting food.

XFICP WHEELER L

<u>Trashy Town</u> by Andrea Zimmerman (1999). This rhythmic, repetitive book will have children chanting along.

XFICP ZIMMERMAN A

Big Green Crocodile: Rhymes to Say and Play by Jane

Newberry (2020). This book will entertain and delight children and build their vocabulary and cognition.

<u>Hush! A Thai Lullaby</u> by Minfong Ho (1996). A rhyming lullaby which asks animals such as a lizard, monkey, and water-buffalo to not disturb the sleeping baby.

<u>Digger, Dozer, Dumper</u> by Hope Vestergaard (2013).

Rhymes and colorful illustrations invite young readers to meet their favorite trucks and vehicles.
