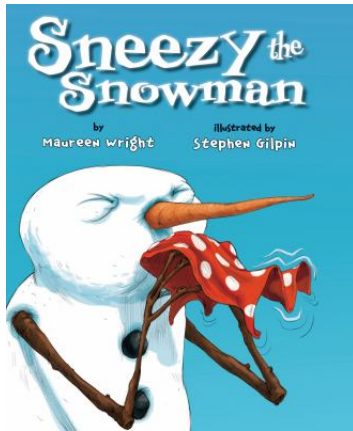


# KINDERGARTEN READINESS TIPS

looking for his lunch.

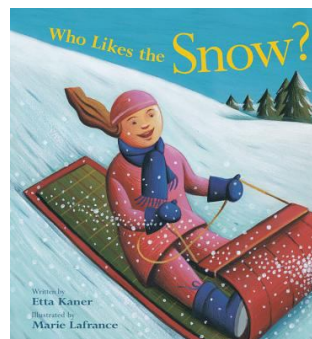
Ate my carrot nose, nibble, nibble,
